**HB 1219** 

The Maryland Educator **Shortage Reduction Act** 

This is a timely bill designed to address Maryland's statewide educator shortage through scholarships, loan assistance, and internship stipends. It expands access to the Teaching Fellows for Maryland scholarship program and the Janet L. Hoffman loan assistance program, which provide tuition and loan assistance to current and aspiring Maryland educators, and it gives priority consideration for financial support to former school staff who are training to become teachers. It also aims to diversify the teacher pipeline by investing in early outreach efforts and providing up to \$20,000 in teaching internship stipends to aspiring educators at Historically Black Colleges and Universities and some community colleges.

**HB984** 

#### **Public Employee Relations Act**

The Public Employee Relations Act consolidates Maryland's three public sector labor relations boards into a new Public Employee Relations Board (PERB). Members of the PERB are required to have knowledge of and experience with labor law or labor relations. The legislation harmonizes and streamlines various provisions of Maryland's public sector collective bargaining statutes for different code. Deputy directors appointed by the PERB will be responsible for overseeing labor relations in their assigned subject matter field, including state labor relations, higher education labor relations, and public school labor relations.

SB 610

#### **Primary and Secondary** Education – Virtual Education

This legislation establishes essential guardrails for the creation and operation of virtual schools, procedures for in-person schools temporarily using virtual learning due to weather or other emergencies, and a study of virtual education best practices. It protects staff by stating that virtual educators must be public school employees with collective bargaining rights and that educators may not be required to teach in-person and online students concurrently. It also requires that students have access to technology, extracurriculars, and wraparound services and that the student body of virtual schools reflects the diversity of the county.

**HB 2** 

#### Income Tax - Subtraction Modification - Union Dues

House Bill 2 authorizes a subtraction modification on Maryland's state income tax for a worker's union dues. Maryland now joins the ranks of other states which authorize income tax deductions for union dues. Through collective bargaining, union workers raise labor standards in their workplaces that have a positive spillover effect for union and non-union workers alike in their community. This legislation takes a meaningful step to recognize the value that unionized labor plays in our economy and in our communities.

**HB 200** 

#### **Budget - Phase Out BOOST Voucher Program**

- Senate Budget and Taxation Committee Amendment
- House Floor Vote on Budget Amendment

Governor Moore introduced a budget that reduced funding and phased out the BOOST voucher program. The House Appropriations Committee voted to support Governor Moore's proposal. However, the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee proposed amending the House action and level funding the program from last year and eliminating the phase-out language. Additionally, delegates on the House floor proposed an amendment to the budget to eliminate the phase-out language. While the conference committee ultimately settled on less money for the BOOST program than last year, the Senate committee position to allow the program to add new students also was part of the final compromise. The House floor amendment was scored and the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee vote was scored.
